What to Do With Your Guyku

- Add your signature and frame your guyku!
- Post your guyku on a wall.
Add more to make a "Guyku Gallery."
- Ask your teacher to let you and your friends make a "Guyku Gallery" in a classroom or hallway at school.
- Collect your guyku and create a book.
- Send a guyku to a friend—mail it, email it, text it, IM it, Facebook message it!

- Memorize a guyku and surprise somebody by reciting it unexpectedly!
- Sing your guyku.

- Choose one guyku each week, and declare it "Guyku of the Week."
- Ask your teacher if everyone at your school can create a guyku. Your school's morning announcements can include a "Guyku of the Day!"

What to Do With Your Guyku

- Put together a time capsule full of guyku. Bury it. Dig it up ten years from now!
- Design a scavenger hunt where all the clues are guyku.
- Create a guyku outside using sidewalk chalk.
- On Valentine's Day, hand out decorated guyku as your valentines!
- Draw shapes (like a leaf or a star) and write your guyku inside them. Cut out the shapes and make a guyku mobile to hang from the ceiling.
- Try writing your guyku on a cake with frosting! Or, ask your family to have a bakery write it on your next birthday cake.
- Share a silly guyku to make somebody laugh.
- Hide guyku around your house and watch your family discover them!
- Buy a white T-shirt and write your guyku on it with T-shirt paint. (Ask for help!)
- Gather all your friends who create guyku and hold a guyku poetry reading! Invite everyone to come and listen.
- Play "Who Wrote This Guyku... Was it YOU?" Have all your friends write a guyku. Fold the guyku, put them in a hat, and shuffle them. Have each person pull out a guyku. Each person must guess who wrote the guyku he or she is holding!

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
